HAVE YOU NOTICED OUR NEW LOGO?



The purpose of the Rocky Mountain District is to serve our congregations and pastors as they seek to multiply healthy disciples, healthy leaders, and new congregations. As we prayerfully considered our vision and our distinctives as part of the EFCA, we were led to choose an evergreen tree as our unifying symbol. The tree connects us with our national EFCA logo. but it is also a tree that is highly visible in all three states in our district.

The three sets of branches represent Colorado, Wyoming, and South Dakota, and their shape depicts our support of one another as we partner to saturate each region with the gospel while raising up healthy churches and leaders. The bottom blue arrow represents the water and reservoirs common in our district, the green is for the prominent ponderosa pines throughout the three states, and the top teal green represents new growth. The upward arc of the tree reminds us of our Source of strength, health, and growth.

PLEASE MEET JIM AND LEDA KIMBRIEL

Redemption Valley Church, Elizabeth, Colorado

There I sat. Having my blood pressure taken for the third time by my friend who happened to be a cardiologist. Again the reading was high enough to put me in the hospital, but he knew what was going on in my life. Kerri, my wife of 36 years was dying and the stress of it all was showing up in my health. He prescribed some meds and set another appointment. As pastors we are called on to be the calming voice when others are in crisis or are hit with tragedy. What about the pastor in crisis in a country church? Who is their calming voice? Where do you go when your wife needs you, your kids need you, your church needs you, and you are without support? Nothing prepared me for this. I cared for my wife through her fifteen months of brain tumors and I was there when she died. By the time she died, I was out of energy. Then came the waves of grief for both me and my kids. I stepped out of ministry and spent time with my kids.

Before my wife died, she had a revelation. She had picked out my next wife. This next wife was in our church and her husband Kevin died three months before Kerri. Kerri knew I was pretty worthless without a mate. So she was excited for me when she told me who I was to marry next. Eight months after Kerri died, I married Leda. We cared for each other in our grief and slowly began ministering to widows, the terminally ill, and teaching the Bible at Ridgeline Community Church in Castle Rock. Having grown up in the Free Church and having been a pastor on staff at Southern Gables Church in Littleton, I felt like I was back where I belonged. For seven years I had pastored an independent church in Elizabeth. In that time, I realized how alone it can be in ministry without the help and camaraderie of other pastors and churches. How different it felt at Ridgeline when I saw the students attend a district retreat or saw the church leadership supported by the district staff as the church was searching for a senior pastor. I saw once again the gift of a fellowship of like minded pastors and churches working together and encouraging one another.

After a year of marriage, Leda and I began looking at pastoring opportunities in our area. We felt we needed to stay close to Elizabeth for the stability of our two kids who were in High School. They needed their friendships and schooling to not be upended when their lives had changed so much with the death of a parent. We also knew we wanted to be a part of the Free Church. At that time, I spoke to our District Superintendent, Barry Vegter, and expressed a desire to be considered for a church plant in Elizabeth. He introduced me to Kevin Boaz, the District's Director of Multiplication and Leadership Development, and Kevin signed us up for the process of being considered as a church planter.

After filling out multiple tests and assessment tools, Leda and I attended the RMD Church Planting Boot Camp in January and were accepted. We came home, pushed hard and began <u>Redemption Valley Church</u> with in person meetings starting on February 11th. By the time we started, we had twenty-five people with us in the plant. Currently, we meet in a 100+year old building, formerly the town hall for Elizabeth. We live on a little forty acre ranch with Black Angus cattle, chickens, dogs, and cats. So we always have good animal stories!

Pastors ask me what is it like to plant a church at my advanced age of sixty-one. It is very challenging. It takes more energy than I have. It takes more faith than I posses. It takes more patience than I have. Even so, it is pretty amazing to be a part of a work that could bring Christ glory until He returns. I so want to make sure I am preparing a bride for Christ that excites Him. Please pray for Leda and me as we seek to bring glory to God in Elizabeth Colorado through Redemption Valley Church.

Recently, ministry leaders in the RMD and leaders throughout the EFCA's Districts were part of two conferences that were hosted by the Rocky Mountain District.

The first conference was our annual RMD Spring Conference on April 16-17, at Faith EFC in Ft. Collins, CO. Faith Church did an excellent job hosting the conference. We invited Dr. Larry Osborne to come and teach our ministry leaders about some important leadership principles that they can apply to their individual ministries. We learned from six workshop leaders who taught on a variety of topics relevant to their lives and ministries. We enjoyed refreshing times of worship, prayer, and fellowship together. Finally, during our business meeting we unanimously passed our next budget and spent time discussing the topic of how we can more effectively work together in living out our mission as churches in the RMD. Pray that the learning that happened at this conference would take root and lead to several applications in the lives of our ministry leaders and churches.

The second conference was a gathering of ministry leaders from throughout the EFCA. We met at New Life EFC in Aurora, CO on May 7-9. New Life Church did a wonderful job hosting this conference in cooperation with the EFCA's All Peoples Ministry which focuses on God's heart for all of the people groups in the world. We learned together how God is inviting us to reach the different cultural groups represented in the communities where God has planted each of our EFCA Churches. We focused on how we can bring the gospel of grace to every man, woman, and child within our communities, and then as people who become followers of Jesus, we can learn to worship and disciple one another together in the midst of our diversity. What a worthwhile undertaking for all of our EFCA churches. We want to be intentional to pursue what is described in Revelation 7:9-12:

"After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen.'"

The Lord was glorified as we gathered at these two conferences to seek Him together.
