# **PROVE IT!**

Kevin Boaz, Director of Multiplication and Leadership Development

I recently had the joy of preaching from John 15, the well known picture of the gardener, the vine, and the branches. I have called this passage the "Grape Commission" because it says disciples of Jesus produce fruit.

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples." John 15:7–8

Bearing much fruit is what demonstrates to the world that we are disciples of Jesus. Fruit bearing has inward transformation to become more like Jesus and outward fruit such as good deeds, obedience, and disciple-making. All fruit ultimately is produced by staying connected to the vine and through the power of the Holy Spirit. I can't force fruit into my life and our local churches can't force fruitfulness. Yet what does this passage say about where fruitfulness begins?

Fruitfulness begins with abiding in Jesus which then leads us to fruitful prayers. This declaration to ask whatever you wish is a call to pray in line with God's will. As Jesus declared in his prayer, "your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

At our district conference, we asked those in attendance to set an alarm on their watch for 10:02 to represent Luke 10 verse 2 which calls us to pray to the Lord of the harvest for laborers. Matthew 9:35-37 is a parallel passage with this command. I believe that prayer aligns with God's will so that as we abide in Jesus we will see much fruit produced.

Since that time, if you are like me, you have probably prayed some, but maybe not prayed consistently at 10:02 am or pm. I want to encourage you to pick 2 days a week and set an alarm on your watch or phone as a reminder to pray. Here are some ways we have seen God answering our prayers. CONTINUED ON PAGE 3.

- God surprised Rachel and me with a clear conviction and call to go fulltime with the RMD which was affirmed by you all last Spring. I started full time December 1st!
- Caleb and Brittany Haynes are church planting residents at Faith Church, Fort Collins, CO, who will plant in Loveland, CO, in 2024.
- We have seen an increase in applications to become church planters and have assessments for those applicants on the horizon.
- We are finding new ways for every local church of any size to invest in church planting.
- We are seeing God creatively work through partnerships to form new ethnic congregations, new campuses, and new models of church planting.

Our 2022 Fall Conference began momentum toward a district of leaders and local churches who seek the Lord through Scripture-Led, Spirit-Fed prayer.

- The DLT (District Leadership Team) as they seek God's direction for our district and work on a vision plan.

- Pray for each of our HPG's (Healthy Pastor Networks) to discern where the next new plant should be in their region.
- Pray for laborers for the harvest in the RMD and for laborers from within congregations in the RMD. Specifically ask for 3 new planters in 2024, at least one of whom would be an ethnic planter.

Stephen Moore, Cañon City, Colorado

My name is Stephen Moore; I'm the new Senior Pastor of <u>Cañon City's Evangelical Free Church</u>. Though I've been a pastor in the EFCA since 2012, I'm new to the Rocky Mountain District and delighted to share a little more about myself.

I was raised in a military family, my father was Air Force, so we moved around quite a bit in my youth. We did end up settling in Texas where I attended and graduated from high school. While in high school, a faithful youth pastor pursued me with the gospel, and, though I didn't become a Christian at that point, God was already priming my heart for His redemptive grace.

I attended college at the University of North Texas, and while there came to realize my life was missing something, or more precisely someone. This realization drove me to the Bible looking for answers, where I saw my sinfulness and beauty of our Savior. As a new Christian, I was blessed to have a faithful local church pour into me during a pivotal period of my life. It was also during those early years that I began to feel a call to vocational ministry, though the specifics of that ministry would only take shape with time.

After college, I worked with a ministry called Doulos Ministries in Westminster, CO. While there, I worked with at-risk adolescents sharing the love of Christ. It was also at this point that I met my future wife, Katherine Carey from Littleton, CO, who was also working at Doulos. After we were married at what was then Southern Gables EFCA, we moved to Texas to attend Dallas Theological Seminary (DTS). During our time at DTS, we had our first two children.

After finishing my ThM (Master of Theology) at DTS, I enjoyed seminary so much that I went to TEDS (Trinity Evangelical Divinity School) to pursue PhD work in New Testament Studies. During my time at TEDS, Katherine and I both began to feel some desire to pursue vocational ministry in the local church. Finishing the coursework stage of my PhD opened the door for us to explore new opportunities, which led us to Oshkosh, WI, where I became the Assistant Pastor at Oakbrook EFCA. It was during that season that our third child, Evangeline, who was two and a half at the time, was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer. Though she was given 9 months to live, God blessed us with 5 years and so many sweet memories with her. During that season, we had our fourth child, and God called us to our second congregation, Lakes EFCA in Lindstrom, MN. There I served as the Pastor of Adult Ministries for five years. During our time in Minnesota, we began sensing a call to a Senior Pastor role. So, we began praying and seeking opportunities to see where the Lord would take us next.

We're delighted to be back in Colorado, where Katherine is from, and where our story together began. We also couldn't be more excited to serve in Cañon City and join what God has been faithfully doing in the Free Church there.
